

**VILLAGE OF COOLVILLE
REGULAR MEETING
MAY 10, 2022**

Village of Coolville Council convened in regular session on Tuesday, May 10, 2022 at the Village Hall on Main Street. Mayor Roxanna Chiki called the meeting to order at 7:10p.m.

Roll call: Councilwoman Toncray: Present, Councilman Rood; Present, Councilwoman Ledson Via phone, Councilwoman Boggs Absent.

Councilman Rood led the pledge of allegiance to the flag. Councilwoman Toncray made a motion to approve the minutes of the April 12th, meeting, seconded by Councilwoman Boggs, all voted yes by roll call vote.

Mayors Corner: The lawsuit against the Village has been settled, and Rose can come back as Mayor, Council will send her a letter for her to respond to as her intentions.

Sewer: There is a problem with a pump on Meadow Lane, have to order new floats. We also need to order new timers for the 144 and Library tank fields.

Old Business: The flags have been taken down, Councilman Rood said he would double check to make sure there are all in good shape.

New Business: Call was received asking if the Village had a solar panel restriction in the Village. Rumpke let the Village know they are changing the style of the larger user dumpsters so their trucks could dump them easier.

Ordinance & Resolutions: Councilman Rood made a motion to accept the Resolution Accepting the Amounts and Rates as set forth from the Budget Commission, Councilwoman Toncray 2nd it, all voted yes by roll call vote.

Safety and Personnel: Talked about some training coming up for the Solicitor.

Finance: Councilman Rood made a motion to accept the 3rd reading of Resolution 2022-04 Adopting ORC as Village Code, Councilwoman Toncray 2nd it, all voted yes by roll call vote. Councilman Rood made a motion to adopt Resolution 2022-04 Adopting ORC as Village Code, Councilwoman Toncray 2nd it, all voted yes by roll call vote.

Streets: The library is replacing the concrete in front of it, they need the Village to look at the drain grate to see how to support it, Councilman Rood said he would check it out. Danny would like for the Village to purchase a push lawn mower to use on some of the Village mowing. Councilwoman Toncray made a motion to purchase a push mower not to exceed \$500.00, Councilman Rood 2nd it, all voted yes by roll call vote. Councilman Rood will look into getting it. There is a patch of grass by the bench by the post office that needs mowed, they will have Danny take care of it. Need to clean up the cinders on the streets as well, it was mentioned that the City of Belpre has a street sweeper and has help in the past. Council will contact them to see if they might be able to do it.

Water: Councilwoman Boggs reported that she checked Jerry Cosner's meter and it doesn't have dog feces on it, Council asked if it may be near it and running into the pit when it rains. Council will look into it. One adjustment this month is due to a pool fillup, it is a \$50.00 sewer adjustment, Councilwoman Toncray made a motion to approve the adjustment, seconded by

Councilwoman Boggs, all voted yes by roll call vote. Danny would like for the Village to purchase a cordless meter pit pump so he could carry it with him to use when reading meters. Mayor Chiki contact ORWA to see if they could suggest a pump and they did. Cost is \$229.00 and we should purchase a longer hose to run the water away as we pump it out. Council also discussed purchasing a couple of extra batteries. Councilwoman Toncray made a motion to purchase the suggested pump and accessories not to exceed \$450.00, seconded by Councilwoman Boggs, all voted yes by roll call vote. Council said they also will have Danny pick up a sprayer for the weed killer as already approved. There has been some complaints about water bills being estimated, Mayor Chiki talked with the Water Clerk about it. Bills were estimated once this winter when the snow was to deep. It is not being done on a regular basis and when it is done it is noted on their bill. It is a manual process to estimate the bills in the system.

Buildings and Grounds: House on 2nd Street that was knocked down needs to be cleaned up. There is a house on North Street that needs addressed as well. Mayor said to give her a list of the ones we need to look into. Councilwoman Boggs said she would ask the Fire Department if they might be able to bun the on North Street down.

Nuisance: Residents are concerned about people running the stop sign on Campbell and Rock Street, Chief said he would patrol it more.

Police Report: Chief Smith asked if we could look into getting fuel at another place for more options and better times of being open. Mrs. Rife is still interested being on Council. Councilwoman Toncray made a motion to appoint Dale Rife to an open Council seat starting with the June meeting, pending a background check, seconded by Councilwoman Boggs, all voted yes by roll call vote.

Citizens' Concerns: The area around the water tower needs mowed and cleaned up, and question was asked if the water tower should have maintenance done to make sure the water is safe to consume? Council reported the water is tested regularly and is safe. Founders Day group has asked the Villge to close Main Street from the school to 10th Street for The Founders Day celebration on June 11th. Councilwoman Toncray made a motion to close Main Street as requested, seconded by Councilman Rood, all voted yes by roll call vote. They also asked the Village to pay for the Porta Johns for the celebration at a cost of \$380.00 for Founders Day. Councilwoman Toncray made a motion to pay for the Porta Johns not to exceed \$400.00, seconded by Councilwoman Boggs, all voted yes by roll call vote. Scott Miller here to check on his public records request, still needing the requested maps and meeting recordings, Council reported the are working on getting it done.

Councilwoman Toncray made a motion to pay bills, seconded by Councilwoman Boggs, all voted yes by roll call vote. Motion carried.

Councilwoman Toncray made a motion to adjourn, seconded by Councilwoman Boggs, all were in favor. Motion carried. Meeting adjourned at 8:31pm.
